Here's what she had to say—


Vania: Hello, hello, Trezure! Welcome back. How are you?

Vania: Virginia's got a real heartbeat, and Newport News is a big part of yours. How does growing up there shape your Artistry?

Vania: Let's go ahead and get right into it. So, Trezure B. Coles—who is she?

Trezure: She is a human being, okay? She's everything—everything under the sun, everything you can imagine. I'm a Child of God, a lover of my art, a daughter, a sister, a niece, a cousin, a bundle of joy. I feel everything, and sometimes that's my superpower, and sometimes it's my kryptonite.

Trezure: Newport News taught me what storytelling really is. Not in a school setting or a book, but in life—in the salon with my mom, riding in the car with my dad, seeing how people moved in my community. From a young age, I was enticed by the way people told stories with their words and bodies. That's what made me fall in love with performing, even before I knew I wanted to be an actor.




Vania: Virginia's got a real heartbeat, and Newport News is a big part of yours. How does growing up there shape your Artistry?

It also taught me about hustle. You see so many talented people in Virginia, but not everyone gets the chance to share their gifts on a bigger stage. Kemi Layeni, based in Hampton, Virginia, is a multidisciplinary artist—visual artist, filmmaker, actress, and stand-up comedian—whose work unpacks the intersections of race, gender, sexuality, and history. Currently an MFA Filmmaker at NYU Tisch, Kemi brings academic rigor and artistic depth to every medium she touches. Her art centers the narratives of Black peoples and the African diaspora, creating space for stories that challenge and redefine perspectives.

Through photography, film, and installation, Kemi's art interrogates and complicates societal narratives. Her 2018 TED Talk at TED Headquarters highlighted her fearless approach, as she shared work that disturbs, provokes, and reveals. Kemi's goal? To present unflinching truths that reflect the fullness of

Kemi is also the creator and star of two dramedy web series, Quicksand and Seeds. These projects reflect her versatility and authenticity, blending humor and heart with raw, layered storytelling. Her training as an MFA filmmaker at Tisch sharpens her ability to craft narratives that resonate across screens and stages alike.


