THE ART OF BREAKING THROUGH

VANIA: Billiards VMSOA is back in full swing after a very long hiatus, and we're showing love to some of Virginia's and the DMV's dopest artists. Here today to kick it all off is the 757's very own, Deja Unique! Welcome!

DEJA: Thank you so much for having me!

VANIA: Okay, Deja, tell us a bit about yourself. Where are you from?


DEJA: Well, I was born and raised in Norfolk, Virginia. I'm an artist of multiple mediums—I paint, direct, write, and, of course, I'm an actress.

VANIA: Okay, we have a fellow Norfolk baddie! I'm also from Norfolk. What do you think about your Virginia upbringing that influences you to gravitate toward certain projects, if at all?

DEJA: Yeah, I think just being around the melting pot of people here in Virginia. I feel like we're very grounded here—raw and authentic. And I think that influences the shows I want to watch, which in turn influences the shows I want to be a part of.

VANIA: That's dope! So, what about growing up in VA do you feel like was a plus?

DEJA: All the different vibes we have here. You can go 15 minutes from Norfolk and be at the beach, laid out in the sun, or you can go downtown and catch a cool vibe there. We've got mountains, snow—it's like everything you want is here.





VANIA: Very niche question, but very 757-coded. What beach are you talking about? Ocean View? Oceanfront? Chicks Beach? Virginia Beach?

DEJA: Virginia Beach—the Oceanfront.

VANIA: Yes, that gives \*outside . I don't know about laid out there, though! That gives outside, shaking tail! Okay, now, this next question is super cliché, but I gotta ask: What is the ultimate dream? What's the goal?

**DEJA:** The ultimate dream for me is to be able to pull people from where I once was and bring them to the forefront, you know, so they can tell their stories. I feel like I come from a family full of artists, and I just want to put them in positions wardrobe

people up.

VANIA: I love that! Now, taking us back a bit—you actually have history with BILLIARDS, which is where I remember you from. We were part of a 9week workshop for a TV series in development. I remember you had so many hilarious moments! You were so good. Can you walk us through what that experience was like for you?

DEJA: That was so much fun! Just being able to get those scripts the day of really informed me because that was before I did any episodes of TV or wrote my first play. It taught me so much—being on set, getting scripts day by day, and just trusting the process.

VANIA: Fast forward about a year later, in 2023, you were part of a workshop at Zeiders American Dream Theater in Virginia Beach for BILLIARDS: The Play. Could you tell us more about what that was like?

DEJA: That was my first time doing a live read for a group of people. It was a lot of fun—preparing that week before, diving into the script. I learned so much about writing, analyzing scripts, and how changes happen throughout the process.

VANIA: Wait—you said live read. Can you specify what you mean by that?

DEJA: It's when you have the script in front of you, not completely memorized, but reading with all the characters beside you and being in the world, but not fully

immersed.

VANIA: Wow, okay. So, you stay booked and busy. What keeps you grounded through it all, especially now that you're fully submerged in the industry?




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


# THE BILLIARDS CANNAS WHAT'S TEA?
